## From Fr. Emmanuel...

By the time you read this, I will be back at the University of Friburg, Germany, eager to begin my last semester of graduate studies. I want to thank you all very much for welcoming me to your parish and for your many acts of kindness shown to me and for your generosity.

Your donations to me will help in my studies, but more importantly to me, also helps me to support my mother and my family. My mother, whose name is Pudentiana, is a 74-year-old widow (my father died in 2006) and she lives in Kibugo, Rwanda, which is in the Eastern part of the country. One of my sisters (I have 2 brothers and 4 sisters) is sick and unable to care for her children, so my mother is caring for her 4 children and also 3 other grandchildren. The children range in age from 9 years old to 17 years old. They are all in school and I pay for their tuition, which is about \$300 a year for each child to attend a public school. My mother prays everyday for the parishioners of St. Joseph's Church and thanks God for your generosity. My mother knows that her grandchildren are receiving the necessary education that will enable them to get into college and have a good life. They will then support my mother. This is the "Social Security System" in Rwanda!

Today is the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and we come to the end of the Christmas Season, so I give you greetings in Swahili – *Kheri ya Krismas na Baraka ya Mungu Kwa Mwaka Mpya – Merry Christmas and God's blessing in the New Year.*

Thank you again and know that every day I remember you and I pray for you. If you are in Friburg, Germany before October 2010, please contact me and I will show you the city!
